Obituary

John Clifford Siverd



John Clifford Siverd, 68, was born in Washington, D.C., and died in Teton Valley Hospital on May 17, 2014. He and his wife Nancy have resided in Alta since 2001. John received a B.S. in finance from the University of Notre Dame and an MBA from the University of Massachusetts. Professionally, John’s background was in finance, with a career on Wall Street in institutional sales and investment banking. In the years prior to moving to Teton Valley, John and Nancy lived and raised their sons in New Jersey. John participated in community volunteer activities in New Jersey, such as the Jaycees (starting one of the first recycling centers in N.J.) and the local volunteer ambulance corps (of which he was President and a volunteer EMT).

In Teton Valley, John was on the board of Friends of the Teton River, and served as its President for several years. He and his wife co-chaired the Registration Committee for the first four Tin Cup Challenges. Until his recent illness, John was a member of the board of the Community Foundation of Teton Valley. He loved Teton Valley, and was an avid fly fisherman, biker and golfer. He is survived by his wife Nancy, his son Clifford and family of North Carolina, his son John and family of Pennsylvania, five grandchildren (Mackenzie, Kyle, and Dylan of P.A., and Preston and Portia of N.C.), his sister Mary Carol Staiger of Alta, and his brother Robert of Ohio. A memorial gathering was held on Sunday, May 18, in the barn by the Siverds’ home in Alta.

Huntsman Springs names Eric Lyman golf director

Huntsman Springs has announced that Eric Lyman has been named Director of Golf for the 1,350-acre community featuring an award-winning golf course designed by David McLay Kidd.

“I’ve been a part of the Huntsman Springs golf program since day one, and it’s a tremendous honor to serve as Director of Golf and to see how everyone’s hard work has come to fruition,” said Lyman. “The golf course continues to receive awards and the membership keeps growing. But what is really special is knowing that what we do is for a greater cause...finding a cure for cancer through our support of the Huntsman Cancer

Institute.” Lyman was previously Head Golf Professional at Sedona Golf Resort in Arizona and an Assistant Golf Professional at Coral Canyon Golf Club in St. George, Utah. He is an alumnus of Utah Valley University and is a Class “A” Member of the Professional Golfers’ Association. He is also a “Certified PGA Member,” a distinction only three percent of PGA professionals achieve. At Huntsman Springs, Lyman supervises a staff including Head Professional Paul Milton and two assistant professionals. They form the backbone of the Huntsman Springs Golf Program that will host the annual invitation-only Kidd Cup to be held August 14-16, 2014. Private golf clubs from around the country are invited to participate with their club professional and seven members. “Huntsman Springs last won the cup in 2011 and we expect to bring it home again this year,” said Lyman.
